



# Domaine des Terres Falmet

An outstanding vineyard site. A winegrower at home in Languedoc.

The estate is set in the heart of Languedoc, within the Saint-Chinian appellation area, midway between the Mediterranean Sea and its unspoilt beaches, the foothills of the Cevennes, the magnificent medieval walled city of Carcassonne, Spain and the majestic Pyrenees.

In 1996, Yves Falmet bought a vineyard on a prime winegrowing site in the Saint-Chinian appellation area in Languedoc.

Yves Falmet comes from a family of farmers based in Rouvres les Vignes, a small winegrowing village in Champagne.

It was here, as a child, that he learnt to work in his parents' vineyards located on "real", steep slopes, probably nurturing his attraction for this type of vineyard on extreme inclines.

Located between two villages, Cébazan and Creissan, the vineyard is unique for Languedoc.

In a region where the vast majority of vines are planted on the plains and where most estates have fragmented plots, Yves' vineyard is an exception, with its plots all grouped together on such extreme terrain.

Because of the slope, there is little mechanization and most of the work is still done by hand (planting, pruning, crown suckering, disbudding, trellising, harvesting...), which helps rein in yields and control the quality of the fruit.

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
